EAA reinforces its recycling dimension

Brussels, 1st October 2013: The European Aluminium Association (EAA) is pleased to announce the appointment of Magdalena Garczynska as the Director of its new Recycling Department. This new position will strengthen the expertise of EAA on an industry segment that is a cornerstone of the aluminium industry's sustainability.

"The appointment of Magdalena comes at a crucial time as the EU starts to revise its waste legislation. Being a recycling champion, the aluminium industry has a significant role to play in this revision" EAA's Director General Gerd Götz stated. She also worked at the NSF International and the Berlin University of Technology. Magdalena holds a M.Sc. degree in mechanical engineering and a post-graduate degree in Fluid Dynamics.

The EAA has enlarged its membership to recyclers that were previously represented by the Organisation of the European Aluminium Recycling industry (OEA), and consequently founded a new Recycling Department to be headed by the Recycling Director.
